£2MILLION INVESTMENT IN WEST HENDON BROADWAY

Conservative Councillors have secured an additional £2 million pound investment to improve West Hendon Broadway for residents, businesses and shoppers.

Since we were elected as your ward Councillors, Barnet Conservatives have been working with the Council, the West Hendon Town Team and residents to develop a plan for growth and investment.

The £2 million pounds will go towards:

- improving shop fronts
- supporting existing and new businesses
- installing new seating and bicycle racks
- greening the Broadway with new trees and parklets

- improving lighting and CCTV
- creating new workspaces for local entrepreneurs
- building a sense of place with new public art and murals
- enhancing connectivity to the Welsh Harp and West Hendon
- Playing Fields, which is also benefitting from an £18 million pound investment.

Some short-term improvements have already happened, including at the junction of Stanley Road, and work is underway to improve the appearance of the Way 2 Save cash and carry. This is just the start and we look forward to sharing progress.

Labour held West Hendon for over 40 years, but opposed investment from Hendon Waterside.

CRIME AND POLICING: THE FACTS FOR BARNET

Conservative Councillors have been fighting for a new neighbourhood Police Station after our previous one on Vivian Avenue was closed by Labour's Mayor of London, against the wishes of local residents.

We have found a new location in West Hendon, offered at no cost to the Mayor and/or the Met Police. This location has not been accepted.

Not only are Labour failing to give us the space we need, they are failing to give us police officers. Labour's Mayor decides what resources to give each

London Borough and, for too long, Barnet has been short changed.

Your Conservative Council has taken matters into their own hands to keep you safe.

We have recruited and now fund 21 new community safety officers who work to proactively deter crime and assist the police.

COUNCIL TAX: LABOUR MAKING COST OF LIVING CRISIS WORSE


Barnet Conservatives have kept their promise to keep Council Tax under control as the graph opposite shows.

Neighbouring Labour-run councils such as Harrow, Brent, Haringey and Camden have used every opportunity they can to increase Council Tax, this is despite receiving more funding per head.

Residents in Harrow Pay around £260 more than we do in Barnet.

In neighbouring Enfield, residents pay around £100 more – this is without the additional cost of Mayor Khan’s precept, which has been increased by an eye-watering 8.8% for 2022.

Here in Barnet, your Conservative Council has frozen Council Tax for next year, we understand that the cost of living is increasing and are doing the best we can to help **keep your money in your pocket.**

ROAD SAFETY SURVEYS

We have secured funding for a speed and vehicle rat-running survey to look at Vivian Avenue, Allington Road, Sevington

Road and Elliot Road after residents raised concerns about traffic and speeding. Surveys will help inform how we address those issues.

We are also speaking with TFL about improving signalling at the junction of Sation Road and the A41.



INVESTMENT IN ROADS AND PAVEMENTS

We have repaved or resurfaced streets throughout West Hendon including Fryent Crescent, Montagu Road and Goldsmith Avenue as part of our £32 million pound investment over the next four years.

Repaving and resurfacing works will continue in West Hendon under the Conservatives.



SUSTAINABLE BARNET

Barnet Council has set a target to achieve net zero by 2030. We are improving air quality by installing one of the largest electric vehicle charging networks in the UK.

We are also planting thousands of trees locally.

BIN COLLECTIONS TO REMAIN WEEKLY WITH THE CONSERVATIVES
